

Long Beach Police Commission

May 6, 2015

Present: Bob Schaefer, Val Sliva, Chief Sulkowski

- 1. Bob Schaefer informed the commissioners that he was forwarded an email from a resident who was concerned about a contractor parking equipment on the Town right of way and wondered if this was legal. Chief Sulkowski indicated that it is permitted to park on the Town right of way, unless there is a No Parking sign officially placed by the police.**
- 2. Bob Schaefer noticed that someone put hand made signs on the existing parking signs at the Community Center which indicated that parking must be on the proper areas or there would be fines. The Chief was not aware of this and will follow up to see who did this.**
- 3. The Chief is continuing to pursue the cost of the in house camera system which would cover certain areas at Town locations.**
- 4. The Chief indicated that the signs are up in the north parking lot and the parking plaquards have been ordered. The asphalt is in bad repair and needs to be refinished along with new striping. He recommended that this should be completed at a cost of \$7,960. The Commission voted unanimously to recommend to the Council.**
- 5. The Chief informed the commission that criminal justice inspectors will be in Town looking at the police facilities. He indicated that there are several areas in the building that need attention: wood floors redoing, painting, garage floor, at a cost of \$2,131. The Commission unanimously approved to recommend to the Council.**
- 6. As of this date, the Police contract for Duneland Beach had not been returned. The Chief will follow up. The Michiana Shores contract has been returned.**
- 7. The Chief continues to research body cameras and video surveillance cameras.**
- 8. The Commission heard from a resident who attended the meeting and who complained about a situation involving a dispatcher. The resident was not pleased with the demeanor that occurred during some conversations. The Chief did provide explanations on behalf of the**

dispatcher. Bob Schaefer indicated that the resident could file a Formal Complaint which would be reviewed by the Chief and if not resolved, would be reviewed by the Police Advisory Board.

9. There was a discussion from the floor about patrolling the beach and the beach rights issue.
