

The meeting was called to order at 4:00 PM on Wednesday, October 1, 2014. In attendance were Council President Bob Schaefer, councilpersons Bob Angelo, Pat McDonald, Peter Byvoets and Jane Neulieb. Also in attendance were clerk-treasurer Bill de Funiak, town attorney Julie Paulson and street superintendent, Tom Dolph. There were three members of the public in attendance.

Bid opening for leaf pick-up was conducted. Two bids were received of the three bids that were solicited. After review and discussion, council voted unanimously to select Healy Landscaping which was responsive to the Town's request for bid and the lowest bidder. Contract amount was \$59,250.

A bid for street paving was received from Rieth-Riley (of the three bids that were solicited). The bid included costs for the paving of Oriole Tail and repair and re-surfacing of other streets and totaled approximately \$165,000. After discussion, the council unanimously approved the contract with Rieth-Riley.

Building commissioner Keith Durbin presented the qualifications of Aaron Tomscheck, who had been interviewed and selected as the new building inspector. His background, education and references were exceptional and the council unanimously approved his hiring.
